

English drama between the late fifteenth and late sixteenth centuries is as diverse as it is engaging. This anthology brings together eighteen of the most interesting and important dramatic works from the period.


The plays have been chosen to give a broad view of the drama produced in Tudor England. They testify to the eclectic tastes of sixteenth-century audiences, ranging from morality plays (Mankind, Everyman), to comedies inspired by the Roman plays of Terence and Plautus (Ralph Roister Doister), to tragedies inspired by the plays of Seneca (Gorboduc, Cambises). In later plays, morality plots rub shoulders with slapstick comic business (The Longer Thou Livest The More Fool Thou Art, The Three Ladies of London), and classical gods intervene in the affairs of England's regions (Gallathea).

Designed for undergraduate use, this anthology includes extensive explanatory annotations and a substantial introduction to each play; spelling and punctuation have been partially modernised in the interests of making the texts more accessible to students.

For the third edition of this volume a number of changes were made. The Old English material has been substantially revised and expanded, including new translations by Roy Liuzza of "Deor", "Wulf and Eadwacer", and "The Battle of Brunanburh". A selection from Adrienne Williams Boyarin's translation of "The Miracles of the Virgin" is included, along with Sian Echard's translation of selections from Y Gododdin. Matthieu Boyd's translation of the first two branches of the Mabinogi is also new to this edition, together with several Early Irish lyrics.

The 'Love and Marriage' Contexts section has been expanded to include additional material by Christine de Pizan and excerpts from Holy Maidenhood, and the 'Religious and Spiritual Life' Contexts section now includes excerpts from Wycliffite writings. The selection of material by Sir Thomas Malory has also been substantially revised and expanded.





Combines an elementary grammar of the English language from about 1100 to about 1500 with a selection of texts for reading, ranging in date from 1154 to 1500. The grammar includes the fundamentals of orthography, phonology, morphology, syntax, regional dialectology, and prosody. In the thirty-eight texts for reading are represented a wide range of Middle English dialects, and the commentary on each

text includes, in addition to explanatory notes, extensive linguistic analysis.

R.M. Liuzza's translation of Beowulf

has been widely praised for its accuracy, readability and poetic beauty. This edition features an updated introduction, an expanded section of material on Christianity and paganism, and samples of other translations of Beowulf that have appeared since Liuzza's translation was first published. The translation is accompanied in this edition by genealogical charts, historical summaries, and a glossary of proper names. Historical appendices include related legends, stories, and religious writings from both Christian and Anglo-Saxon traditions. These texts help readers to see Beowulf as an exploration of the politics of kingship and the psychology of heroism, and as an early English meditation on the bridges and chasms between the pagan past and the Christian present. Appendices also include a generous sample of other modern translations of Beowulf, shedding light on the process of translating the poem.

Here one may read a Middle English text that is closer to what Chaucer's scribe, Adam Pinkhurst, actually wrote than that in any other modern edition. Unlike most editions, which draw on a number of manuscripts to recapture Chaucer's original intention, this edition preserves the text as it was found in one influential manuscript. A sampling of facsimile pages from the original manuscript is also included, along with a selection of other works that give the reader a rich sense of the cultural, political, and literary worlds in which Chaucer lived. This second edition includes a new Middle English glossary, a timeline of Chaucer's life and times, and detailed page headers showing the fragment and line numbers to assist readers in finding a specific section of the poem.





The fourteenth-century poem Sir Gawain and the Green Knight is one of the greatest classics of English literature, but one of the least accessible to most readers today. Written in an obscure dialect, it is far more difficult to digest in the original than most other late medieval English works. This edition of the poem offers the original text together with a facing page translation. With the alliterative Middle English before the reader, James Winny provides a non-alliterative and sensitively literal rendering in modern English. This edition also provides an introduction, explanatory and textual notes, a further note on some words that present particular difficulties, and, in the appendices, two contemporary stories, The Feast of Bricriu and The Knight of the Sword, which provide an insight on the poem.

All of Gwerful Mechain's known

work is included here - as are several poems of uncertain authorship, and a selection of other works that help to fill in the historical and literary context.

Each medieval Welsh poem is provided in the original language and in two different translations - a literal translation and a second, freer translation, with rhyme patterns approximating those of the original. One of the most striking characteristics of Gwerful Mechain's poetry is the easy coexistence in her oeuvre of devotional and erotic works. Yet, as the introduction discusses, some coexistence of the erotic and the religious was not entirely untypical of medieval literary production in Wales.
